AP/SP 2020 6.0 Intermediate Spanish Abroad

Course Description

The objective of this course is to broaden communicative language skills through written and oral exercises, as well as to develop intercultural skills through interaction with native speakers. It offers a review and reinforcement of grammatical structures and content, for the expansion vocabulary and style, targeting both oral and written skills, which can be specified to the context of the host country. This is an interactive course that provides ample opportunity to explore and deepen previous knowledge of Spanish through in-class individual and group work, multimedia resources, and location-based activities in the Spanish-speaking country.

PREREQUISITES: AP/SP 1000 6.0 or equivalent or permission of instructor.

LANGUAGE OF INSTRUCTION: Spanish

While in Ávila, Spain...



Known best for its fully enclosed medieval walls and as the birthplace of the 16th century poet and mystic Saint Teresa, Ávila is the ideal host city for students seeking to experience Spanish life. With just under 60,000 inhabitants, Ávila is a charming city that is mostly free of tourists (and therefore English and French speakers), located only 1.5 hours from Madrid, it offers fast and easy access to the Spanish capital, for local excursions or international travel.

Program Fee

- \$2,200 CAD
- Accommodations (dorms) at La Universidad Católica de Ávila (UCAV) with WIFI
- Classroom with access to the UCAV library and computer lab.
- Meal plan (breakfast, lunch, and dinner)
- Transportation and Excursions (with guided tours, museums, and more) to Salamanca, Segovia and Toledo.

Tuition

- Tuition fee is the standard **6.0 credit fee** regulated by York University.
- **OSAP** is available, but can only be used for tuition.

Flight, Insurance, and Visa Documentation

- **Flights** are directly booked and paid for by the student.
- Purchasing Health Insurance is highly recommended.
- Students are responsible for contacting the diplomatic mission of their abroad country to obtain the necessary require documents before departure (i.e. **visa documentation**).

Funding

- Students participating in a YorkU Summer Abroad course are eligible for the York International Mobility Award (YIMA).
- Students in the Faculty of Liberal Arts and Professional Studies are also eligible to apply for the LA&PS International Study Abroad Award.

Professor Maria Figueredo

Professor Maria Figueredo is an Associate Professor at the Department of Languages, Literatures and Linguistics at York University, where she teaches courses in Spanish and Latin American literature. Her research focuses on the relationship of literature and music in Latin America, music as a subtext in women's writing, and contemporary innovations in Spanish American literature.
